They are among the most financially vulnerable groups, along with female migrants and women over 65 (ROVNOST ŽEN A MUŽŮ V NEDOHLEDNU Monitorovací zpráva Social Watch k genderové rovnosti 2017) Single mothers comprise 87% of single parents in the Czech Republic. Thus, the issue of one-parent families is often linked to women (Domácnosti z hlediska genderu, 2011).
